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

Introduction

Archive is a repository or store house. Important government records and other valuable historical documents are kept here in well organized process. Mosthly Film related as well as audio documents are preserved here. The role of archive in conserving heritage and history is recognized globally. Each and every country in the world has its own archives. It is known from the history that the first archive was established by the Sumerians. Archaeologists discovered an archive of hundreds of clay tablets dating back to the 3rd and 2nd millennium BC. These discoveries served as fundamental sources for knowledge of the ancient alphabet, language, literature and politics of the time and also established the concept of archives. Assurbanipal, one of the kings of the Assyrian civilization centered in the Middle East-Asia Minor in the 7th century BC, was famous for his own collection. During the Sultanate and Mughal Period in the Indian subcontinent, administrative documents and records were kept in archives called Mahafezkhana. However, document's preservation in the subcontinent gradually started centrally, provincially and locally from the British period.

People in search of new forms of entertainment of making Films or Cinema's in the 18th century. It did not take long for its appeal to spread worldwide. The world's first Film or Cinema archive was established in France in 1935 to collect and preserve these creations. Cinema is a powerful mass media. Each frame of the Films contains time and history. In that regard globally the role of Film Archive is immens.

Bangladesh Film Archive

Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman presented the EPFDC (East Pakistan Film Development Corporation) Bill in the Provincial Council on March 27, 1957 during his tenure as Minister of Industry, Commerce and Labor of the Provincial Government with the aim of developing the Film industry of East Bengal and smoothing its way forward. Later it was passed as Law in the Parliament on April 3, 1957. As a result, BFDC (Bangladesh Film Development Corporation) was established which served as a milestone for Bengali Film making in this region. Honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, the daughter of the Father of the Nation, is a Film buff and culture-loving personality. She declared the historic 03 April as National Film Day and Film producing as an industry.

After the emerge of Bangladesh in 1971 through a long strugle and great Liberation War realizing the importance of establishing a Film archive in Bangladesh like other countries of the world, in 1975 with the cooperation of the Film Movement Association (Film Sangsad), the first Film Archive structure was outlined and presented to the Ministry of Information and Radio. After the tragedy of 1975, this process was stopped. Bangladesh Film Institute and Archive was established on May 17, 1978 through the movement of Artists, Scholars, Film loving people and Film Clubs. It was renamed as 'Bangladesh Film Archive' in 1984.

Bangladesh Film Archive is working as a traditional and specialized institution related to Films under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. Bangladesh Film Archive has completed its 45 years journey this year. It did not have its own infrastructure at the time of establishment. Starting from a rented house in Dhanmondi, the operation was subsequently carried out at Gaznabi Road in Mohammadpur, later moved to college gate, then to Ganabhaban and finally at Shahbagh (National Broadcasting Building). With the cordial cooperation of the Honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, a world-class modern and spectacular Bangladesh Film Archive Building has been built at Agargaon in Dhaka at a cost of Tk 86 crore. The Prime Minister laid the Foundation Stone of Bangladesh Film Archive Building on 27 February 2013 and inaugurated the newly constructed Bangladesh Film Archive Building on 01 November 2018.

Bangladesh Film Archive feel proud for collection of all the visual documents of the great Liberation War and the life and works of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Bangladesh Film Archive is working with a view to convey the important documents of the illustrious career and works of the Father of the Nation to the next generations and getting the real history of the Liberation War. Bangabandhu's historic 7th March Speech has been digitized and preserved for the nation and world wide as well. As a result, in 2017, the historic 7th March Speech was recognized as UNESCO World Documentary Heritage. The Speech also achieved the 'UNESCO' certificate, Bangladesh Film Archive along with 7 (seven) other government institutions were involved in recording and preservation of the Speech. Prime Minister of Government of Bangladesh formally handed over the Certificate to Bangladesh Film Archive accordingly. Video footage of Bangabandhu's 'Joliot Curie' Award giving ceremony on 23 May 1973 is also preserved in the Film Archive.

The world's first Film 'The Lumiere Brothers (1895)' preserved in the archives of Bangladesh Film Archive. East Bengal's first full-length Film, Abdul Jabbar Khan's 'Mukh O Mukhosh (1956)', Kazi Nazrul Islam's 'Dhrubo (1934)', Pramathesh Barua's 'Devdas (1935)', Fateh Lohani's Asiya (1960)', Zahir Raihan's 'Jibon Theke Neya (1970)', Khan Ataur Rahman's 'Nawab Siraj-ud-Daula (1967)' Russia's 'Battleship Potemkin' (1925)', 'Mother (1926)', 'Apur Sangsar (1959)', and many other important films and documentaries also preseved in the Film Archive Vaults.

Films stored in Bangladesh Film Archive are preserved by converting and restoring them in digital format using modern technology. At present, Bangladesh Film Archive's capacity for Film digitization and restoration is world standard. The Digital Lab has real time Film scanners, Film restoration units, color grading units and video editing panels, through which images are recovered from old damaged reels and stored in digital format.

Bangladesh Film Archive has one modern Auditorium with 500 seats, one Projection Hall with 300 seats and one Seminar Hall with 120 seats. The country's only Film Museum with old technology and traditional collections used for Bangladeshi Films, Film equipment, famous Film posters, Still-photography and Memorabilia. There is also a specialized Duplex Library, 06 specialized Film-vaults of different temperatures, 03 Digital Labs, Administrative Block, planned spaces and rooms for various activities including own publications, research, poster-display and organizing film-festivals etc.

Aims and Objectives of establishing Bangladesh Film Archive :

The ultimate goal of Bangladesh Film Archive is to preserve the films and the culture and history of the country in a systematic and scientific way of Films and reels.

The main objectives of establishing the Bangladesh Film Archive are to collect rare and classic Films and Film materials (both from local and foreign) and systematically preserve those for a long time, conduct academic perceptions and research, exhibit collected Films, organize film festivals, use of the library properly, organize seminars, symposiums, workshops, meetings etc. on Films, collection and conservation of films and film related issues. Moreover, ensure contribution to the development of polished and entertainment films by publishing film related magazines, bulletins, catalogues, synopses, screen play etc.

Vision :

Collection and Preservation of Films and film related heritage.

Mission :

Nursing, development and preservation of history, culture and heritage related to films.

Functions of Bangladesh Film Archive

- (a) Procuring Films and Film materials from home and abroad.
- (b) Maintenance and preservation of the collected Films in Film-vaults at controlled temperature and storage of Film materials.
- (c) Printing, reprinting of rare and classic Films and Film materials.
- (d) Periodical examination and reprinting of collected Films and Film materials for long-term preservation, study and research.
- (e) Collect and preserve the books, periodicals, publications, song books, posters, brochures, stills, manuscripts and materials relating to Films.
- (f) Arrange regular screening of Films from archive's collections.
- (g) Expand study opportunities for Film in Archives and Film specialized Libraries.
- (h) Organize seminars, symposiums, workshops, poster exhibitions and meetings etc. on Films.
- (i) Organize Film festivals within the country and outside the country.
- (j) Take initiative for research and publication of Films.
- (k) Conduct training programs on Films and related issues.
- (I) Play special role in developing Film industry through Film museums.
- (m) Maintain communication and liaison with local and international organizations/organizations related to Films etc.

Functions of Different Sections

Administration Section

The administration section performs clerical and administrative activities, along with recruitment, procurement, training etc.

Accounts Section

Manages financial activities like preparing bills, accounts and maintains income-expenditure of Bangladesh Film Archive, salaries of officers and employees as well.

Technical Section (Operation & Maintenance)

- (A) The Technical Section conducts long-term conservation of Films and film related materials by digitizing and restoring the celluloid of Films stored in the Bangladesh Film Archive. Maintenance of all types of machineries, electrical equipment and air-cooling equipment of the office. This section also provides assistance in online services, e-GP activities, exibit all official information through website, online service of Film related products and digital materials etc.
- (B) Bangladesh Film Archive has a state-of-the-art Film vault. The technical department monitors and controls the temperature in 06 specialized Film vaults up to -8° C, -4° C, 0° C, $+4^{\circ}$ C, $+8^{\circ}$ C and $+12^{\circ}$ C.

Under Bangladesh Film Archive 'Construction of Bangladesh Film Archive Bhaban Project' (July 2010-June 2014) for the development and conservation of Film-centric culture of Bangladesh.

A 7th floor building with one basement has been constructed in first stage on 12 storey foundation on 1.12 acres of land in F/5 plot, Agargaon Administrative Area, Dhaka. The building with super structure view divided into three parts named as Auditorium, Tower and Vault Area. Each floor of this building has facilities with special controlled temperature and humidity Film Vault and Film Laboratory, Film Museum, Film Hospital, Film Center, Auditorium, Projection Hall, Festival Office, Alumni Corner, Conference Center, Library, Administrative unit, Cafeteria, Guest room, Meeting room etc.

Ongoing projects

1. Collection and preservation of Liberation War footage from home and abroad and strengthening Bangladesh Film Archive project.

A development project titled "Collection and preservation of Liberation War footage from home and abroad and strengthening Bangladesh Film Archive Project" (July 2021- June 2024) at the cost of Tk 62 crore. Currently underway to enhance the activities and capacity building of manpower Bangladesh Film Archive and to capture and nurture the real history of the Liberation War. Through this project, visual footage, documents of the great Liberation War and the life and works of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, which are now scattered around the world will be collected and will be preserved for the next generation. Also documentation be made on 4 (four) hundred Freedom Fighters. People may know the real history of Independent of Bangladesh.



The Film Archive will make a bridge of history of Films with the people through publicity, campaigns, screenings and ogranizing various events. The Film Museum is open to the public from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm following hygiene rules.

Bangabandhu Memorial Archive is an another addition to the Bangladesh Film Archive. This has been implemented under the Archive's ongoing project 'Collection and preservation of Liberation War footage from home and abroad and strengthening Bangladesh Film Archive project'. In this Museum, necessary steps have been taken to display the digital analysis of the important part of the life and works of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Documentaries made on the great Liberation War of Bangladesh, history, culture and traditions will be digitally screened for the students and visitors. Besides, there is a display corner of important and rare news clipping on Bangabandhu and Bangladesh during the Liberation War.

Documentary

Another significant initiative of the Bangladesh Film Archive, which has already been appreciated by the Film loving people, that is the creation of Biographic Documentation of Bangladeshi Film personalities. About 58 Biographic Documentaries of prominent Film personalities have already been produced under this program. These documentaries are stored in Bangladesh Film Archive's data center. Digitization process










Bangabandhu in short and full length films of Liberation War





Potrayal of middle class in Bangladeshi films and Narayan Ghosh Mita.









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Bangladesh Film Archive Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall Usage Policy-2019

The Bangladesh Film Archive building has an Auditorium with 500 seats, a Projection Hall with 300 seats and a Seminar Hall with 120 seats. In order to ensure the utilization, allocation, maintenance and overall management of the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall, the government has formulated the following policy:

- 1. Short Title: This Policy shall be called "Bangladesh Film Archive Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall Usage Policy-2019".
- 2. Definition: Unless otherwise stated in the subject or context, in this policy:
- (a) 'Authority' means the Director General, Bangladesh Film Archive, F-5, Agargaon Administrative Area, Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, Dhaka-1207;
- (b) "Government" means the controlling administrative ministry of the Bangladesh Film Archive;
- (c) 'Applicant' and 'Service Receiver' means the person or organization interested in using the auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall of Bangladesh Film Archive, who will seek permission to use the respective facilities on payment of rent for a specified period.

3. Objectives to construct Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall:

- 3.1. Conducting theoretical and practical training programs on Films and Film related subjects through the use of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall and the overall development of Bengali Films through Film screenings, Film related Seminars and workshops.
- 3.2. Cooperation through direct and indirect contribution on economic, social, literary and cultural activities including overall development activities of the country.
- 3.3. Opening up opportunities to increase government revenue by renting out Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall.

4. Terms of using the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall:

- 4.1. Persons/institutions interested in using the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall need to apply in writing at least 15 days in advance to the Director General, Bangladesh Film Archive in the prescribed application form.
- 4.2. Director General, Bangladesh Film Archive will scrutinize the application of the interested person/institution and approve it. Note that maximum 07 (seven) days may be allotted to use the facilities for festival needs of individuals/organizations.
- 4.3. If the initial allocation is approved, within 03 working days of receiving of the approval letter, the rent amount must be deposited in cash or through Pay Order to the accounts section of Bangladesh Film Archive and collect the final allocation letter for the purpose of utilizing the Auditorium/Projection Hall/Seminar Hall. Failure to deposit the full amount of rent within the due date will result in cancellation of allotment.
- 4.4. The authority reserves the right to cancel the allotment at any time in case of special needs of the State. In that case, the entire amount deposited by the applicant will be refunded. If an application is made by the applicant for cancellation of allotment,

- 10% will be deducted from the service charge and security deposit before 10 days of the specified date, 15% before 7 days of the specified date, 50% before 1 day of the specified date and 100% on the specified day and the rest will be returned.
- 4.5. If application is made for change of the date of allocated Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall, it will be allocated subject to availability.
- 4.6. The Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall can be used for organizing meetings, Seminars, Workshops, Film Screenings, Dramas, Commemorations of distinguished individuals, various cultural programs, entertainment and educational programs organized by Film related or various government, semi-government, autonomous institutions.
- 4.7. The service receiving institutions can use the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall daily from 09:00 am to 03.00 pm and from 4.00 pm to 10.00 pm (two shifts).
- 4.8. In order to ensure overall security of the Bangladesh Film Archive building, the applicant or his personal will not be allowed to stay in the Bangladesh Film Archive building after 10:15 pm.
- 4.9. No program contrary to national heritage, history, art and culture shall be staged, held or organized in the auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall. Any foreign organization can organize events in the light of their country's history, art and culture if it is not against the history, art and culture of Bangladesh.
- 4.10. The following facilities will be available for use of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall:
 - A) Auditorium: Air-conditioned auditorium with 500 seats with and sound insulation system.
 - B) Projection Hall: Projection Hall with 300 seats with air conditioning system.
 - c) Seminar Hall: Seminar Hall with 120 seats.
- 4.11. The program should be performed using the installed equipment with caution. For the purpose of any event, sound or light equipment can be hired from outside with the permission of Bangladesh Film Archive authority and can be used in the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall. This rented material need to be taken out of the Bangladesh Film Archive building after completion of work.
- 4.12. In case of power outage, generators will be used to supply only the light to the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall. In this case the hourly fuel price has to be paid by the concerned person/institution.
- 4.13. The authority shall not be responsible for any power outage, air conditioning or lighting and sound system problems due to reasons beyond control.
- 4.14. The set and all the goods brought by the person/institution from outside, if necessary, have to be removed from the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall as soon as the program is over. Under no circumstances shall the material brought from outside be stored inside the Projection Hall or any other place.
- 4.15. The persons/institutions taking the service will not be allowed to use any space of the Bangladesh Film Archive building except the designated space for food. Smoking and consumption of drugs are completely prohibited in the premises of Bangladesh Film Archive.

- 4.16. If the Film, staged play or cultural program shown by the person/institution receiving the service is considered by the authorities to be contrary to the national spirit of Liberation War, anti-social, indecent or offensive or provocative, then the authority may at any time immediately stop the program as well as the use of the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall. BFA authority may cancel the permission and in such case, if necessary, legal action may be taken against the person/institution using the auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall. The said person/institution will be considered ineligible to use the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall in future. In such case the amount paid in advance can be deducted.
- 4.17. The person/institution receiving the service shall not use the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall under any circumstances for conducting special courses of any school, college, university or organizing or conducting any political activities.
- 4.18. No firearms, or substances prohibited by the Government shall be carried or stored in the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall or in their vicinity or in the Bangladesh Film Archive building. Failure to do so may lead to legal action by authorities and law enforcement agencies against the person/institution receiving the service.
- 4.19. In the case of use of information and communication technology in Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall, service providers must follow the Policy of the use of information and communication technology, existing laws and regulations.
- 4.20. The person/institution taking the service shall not alter, add or modify the physical infrastructure, equipment and any other facilities of the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall without the permission of the authority.
- 4.21. In case of damage to any product, furniture or any part of the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall by the person/institution using the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall, or if the equipment and accessories are damaged, the person/institution receiving the service, within the time limit prescribed by the Bangladesh Film Archive shall be obliged to pay the compensation at the rate fixed by the authority. Otherwise the authority can take legal action against the concerned person/institution.
- 5. Auditorium, Seminar Hall and Projection Hall Rental Rates:

- 5.2. The Lessee has to pay VAT at the rate prescribed by the government along with the rent.
- 5.3. This fee will not be applicable for any program of His Excellency the President, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Bangladesh Film Archive.
- 5.4. In case of Projection Hall rent, the Lessee has to pay Bangladesh Film Archive Tk 2000/- per shift to use Bangladesh Film Archive's own projector machine, this amount shall be paid in addition to the basic rent.

6. Additional benefits:

- 6.1. 20 car parking spaces in the basement (additional car parking per shift for Jeep/Micro Tk100, Bus/Truck Tk150 and Motorcycle Tk30 on priority basis subject to payment) can be used for each event booking.
- 6.2. In order to provide additional lighting to the existing system of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall only for the purpose of the event, subject to the permission of the authorities, cash deposit of TK500 per shift should be made for the additional electricity cost. In this case, the money will be collected through separate receipts and the money received will be deposited in the government treasury.
- 7. Taking security measures: The persons/organizations interested in using Bangladesh Film Archive's Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall should take their own necessary security measures along with the establishment by contacting the law enforcement agencis or security personnel on their own initiative.

8. Tenants must comply with the following:

- A. Renters can only move to Bangladesh Film Archive authorized areas. They cannot move to places not authorized for them.
- B. The Lessee has to vacate the premises along with the equipment/equipment within the stipulated time.
- C. The lessee may use sound devices to a tolerable level and without disturbing others; however, if any visitor or official asks to control the noise sound, the renter will be obliged to control the noise.
- D. The goods brought to the event must be removed from the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall at their own responsibility and the Security Chief's certification and approval is required before removal.
- E. No act contrary to social, religious, state laws and customs shall be allowed in the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall.
- F. No damage shall be done to any property of Bangladesh Film Archive.
- G. No canopy, pandal or any kind of structure shall be constructed inside the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall for use.
- H. No smoking, lighting of lamps, lighting of candles or use of fire is allowed in the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall or related areas.
- I. No hole can be made inside the Bangladesh Film Archive, and no part of the garden can be harmed or destroyed.
- J. Posters, banners or similar promotional materials shall not be put up any where other than in places specified by the authority.
- K. Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall allocated in the name of any person, organization or institution shall be used only by the person, organization or institution who has been given allocation; no other person, organization or institution shall use the said facilities.

9. Maintenance and Repairs:

- 9.1. The regular maintenance work of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall should be completed by the money received for maintenance from the service receiving organization.
- 9.2. The Bangladesh Film Archive authority and its designated representative shall supervise the regular maintenance and repair work of the physical infrastructure, all machinery and equipment of the Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall.

10. Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall shall not be allocated for organizing programs in the following cases:

- 10.1. Events organized by any political party or its affiliates;
- 10.2. Programs on political or controversial topics;
- 10.3. Indecent music, dancing, acting or similar events;
- 10.4. Weddings or similar social events.

11. Explanation of Policy:

- 11.1. The authority may amend, add or modify the policy regarding multi-use of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall as necessary.
- 11.2. The decision of the authority in the interpretation of any word or words of this policy shall be considered final.

12. Application of Policy:

- 12.1. This policy will be effective from the date of issue.
- 12.2. In all cases, the cancellation, change, addition, correction of the decision of the authority in the light of this policy will be considered as final. In this case, no appeal or application, will be considered acceptable.
- 12.3. In case of use of Auditorium, Projection Hall and Seminar Hall by the person/organization providing the service or receiving the service shall be in compliance with this policy, and the laws, rules, instructions issued by the government from time to time.
- 12.4. If any new matter is added after any clause or sub-clause of this policy, the service providing organization shall make arrangements to inform the person or organization receiving the service.

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Bangladesh Film Archive Governance and Management Policy - 2010

Film is an entertainment medium and also a carrier of national memories, culture and social realities. The importance of developing a rich and modern Film museum or Film archive is immense. It creates opportunities for Film collection, conservation, nursing, research, publication, study and awareness building for the future generations of the country with proper ideas of the national history, heritage and culture. To achieve this goal, 'Film Institute and Archive' was established on May 17, 1978. Later, the organization is conducting the activities under the name of 'Bangladesh Film Archive' since 1984 as per the recommendation of the Enam Committee.

Bangladesh Film Archive-

- (a) is the only national institution for collection and conservation of Films and Film-related materials in the country;
- (b) Takes initiatives to preserve national culture, history and heritage through research, publication of journals and books on related subjects through training, study and awareness building activities;
- (c) Collects and preserves books, periodicals, publications, music books, posters, pamphlets, stills, manuscripts, apparatus and accessories relating to Films;
- (d) Organizes Seminars, symposiums, workshops, meetings etc. on Films; and
- (e) Organize Film screenings, Film festivals, etc. and extends study opportunities for Film lovers with specialized Film libraries as well.

Considering this Bangladesh Film Archive as a repository of Film materials should have a policy. Thus Bangladesh Film Archive Governance and Management Policy–2010 has been formulated which is as follows:

1. Film Collection

Film Collection is one of the important functions of Bangladesh Film Archive. Because Film is a social resource and contains the elements of national history, tradition and culture. All these resources are in danger of being lost forever if not collected. The following procedures will be followed for smooth operation of Bangladesh Film Archive's Film collection.

- a) The existing law [Copyright (Amendment) Act 2005, Sections 16 and 17] regarding compulsory submission of Films to the Bangladesh Film Archive shall be followed. However, the producers must ensure the submission of a good quality and archivable print of each Film produced by them to the Bangladesh Film Archive within one year from the date of release.
- b) Archivable materials related to Films and archival Films will be collected from government, private, local or foreign institutions, organizations, individuals.
- c) All Films made in Bangladesh including full-length and short Films, Films based on Liberation War, classical and aesthetic Films, documentaries, news reels, commercials and archivable Film materials will be collected as courtesy and in cases through purchase or exchange.
- d) Foreign Films and archival Film materials will be collected through courtesy, purchase or exchange, taking into account importance and context.

- e) Any person or organization submitting a Film as a courtesy copy to the archive shall be issued with an initial acknowledgment of receipt and a final acknowledgment of receipt if deemed to be archived after examination.
- f) If a Film does not appear to be suitable for conservation at the time of receipt or after examination, the copy of the Film shall be returned to the depositor and he shall be requested to resubmit another copy of the Film of archival quality to the Bangladesh Film Archive.
- g) Film collection, conservation, research, training, study and other related matters may be communicated/campaigned with local and international organizations, individuals, organizations or mass media, if necessary.
- h) Films and archival Film materials obtained from various sources may be purchased, copied, repaired, edited, printed or reprinted for future needs and long-term conservation.
- j) Films and related materials received, collected, printed, impounded or purchased as courtesy shall be deemed to be the own copy of Bangladesh Film Archive.

2. Film conservation

Film is the most modern medium of art in the world. Application of scientific method, technology and technical knowledge is essential for Film conservation. Standard Film conservation guidelines will be followed:

- a) The collected Films shall be stored in suitable, specially constructed and temperature and humidity controlled Film-vaults prescribed by the Federation of International Film Archives (FIAF).
- b) Taking measures to protect the collected Films through the application of modern conservation methods and information technology, overall and continuous efforts to improve the quality in this regard will be maintained.
- c) Collected Films shall be classified according to type, subject and nature and listed in the register and stored separately in the Film vault.
- d) Initiatives can be taken to set up Film hospital and digital Film laboratory for repairing, editing, restoration, and reproduction etc. of collected, conserved and damaged Films.
- e) Taking into account the importance of the Film, measures will be taken to restore/reprint and conserve the damaged Film as a whole or in part on priority basis.
- f) If it is not possible to conserve the damaged Film by reprinting, repairing or restoring it and if there is a risk of damage to other Films stored in the vault, necessary measures can be taken with the recommendation of the Technical Committee and the approval of the Ministry by mentioning the appropriate reasons.
- g) Arrangements will be made for regular inspection of stored Films, cleaning and keeping the vaults clean.
- h) For the proper maintenance and conservation of the collected Films and Film materials, the necessary equipment and materials/services used for conservation may be collected and procured. If required, local/international consultants may be appointed for this purpose.
- i) The final negative of the Film will be archived. Foreign Film negatives received as an exchange or courtesy can also be conserved.

3. Film supply

In order to avoid complications and confusion in the use of archived Films for national, international and other various purposes, the following guidelines be followed:

- a) No Film from the archive collection shall be made available for commercial exhibition.
- b) Films received as courtesy copies may be supplied only for the temporary needs of the copyright holder subject to the permission of the Bangladesh Film Archive authority. However, in that case, a written commitment to return it within a specified time must be taken.
- c) Rare and important Films whose only copies are conserved in the Bangladesh Film Archive cannot be screened under any circumstances.
- d) Only the Films with multiple copies conserved in the archive can be provided for Film festivals, special and nationally important events, Seminars, symposiums, training, education, research etc. within the country. In that case, written permission of the owner of the Film must be provided to the Archive authority by the recognized authority or organization at least one month prior to the event. There must be a written agreement to return it to the BFA within three working days of the end of the scheduled event.
- e) If any Film supplied by the Archive is returned to the Archive after use and any damage to the Film is observed during the inspection, the person or organization receiving the Film or the Organizing Authority shall be obliged to pay to the Archive the amount charged for repairing, printing or reprinting the said Film. The Bangladesh Film Archive (BFA) authority will determine the value of these damages.
- f) The permission of any Film owner shall not be required for use/exhibition of archived Film in the case of BFA's own arrangement.

4. Film copies and commercial screenings

The archive shall have its own Projection Hall to regular screening of local/international Films. Films conserved in the archive may be shown/used on National Day or any special day or as part of a program or for other purposes subject to the permission of the Archive authority. However, no person, institution, organization or Film society can make any copy of any Film taken from the archive and display it commercially in any form. Proprietors of Films can get copy of copyable Films and avail services and facilities for their use giving fees/charges/rental subject to the permission of the authorities.

5. Library management and use

Guidelines for using specialized library of BFA:

- a) Library will remain open as per Government office schedule. The library will be closed on all public holidays. However, under special arrangements, the library will remain open on 1 day of the weekend (Saturday). The authorities may change this schedule for special occasion if needed.
- b) Film students, teachers, trainers, researchers, workers, technicians, producers, Film connoisseurs and enthusiastic readers will be considered as the main users of the library. Archives officers and employees can also use the library. The Archive authority shall determine the conditions of the use of the Library.

- c) No book or any document can be borrowed from the library.
- d) If any library user damage any book or any other document of the library, the authority can collect appropriate compensation from that person.
- e) Books, screenplays, shooting scripts, song books, stills, posters and other archival materials received or collected or recovered from various sources for future collection may be printed, reprinted or purchased.
- f) Videos/DVDs received in digital format in the library and received Films in other modern formats where applicable will be regularly purchased/collected, displayed and archived.
- g) If it is not possible to reprint, repair or restore any damaged stored or collected Film materials, the necessary measures can be taken by mentioning the appropriate reasons with the recommendation of the Technical Committee and the approval of the Ministry.
- h) Charges may be levied for use of library services/facilities at the rate fixed by the authority from time to time.

6. Publication

Using technology BFA will preserve and manage its reseearches related to films Annual Reports, books, journals, magazines, memories, catalogues, film dictionary, songs, albums, bulletins, introductary books, souvenirs, etc. will also be published. For per gerular publication the Archives authority shall appoint an Editor and an Editorial Board by the recommendation of the Technical Committee. The Director General of Bangladesh Film Archive shall be appointed as the Editor of the publication. The editor and editorial board will prepare the publication plan, collect writings and other materials, evaluate and edit the received writings. A member of the editorial board will serve as Executive Editor in addition to his/her duties to ensure the overall quality of the publication. In publishing the Bangladesh Film Archive Journal, a designated officer/employee of the Archive shall be appointed as journal Editing Associate and a Computer Operator as Editing Assistant. The journal will be published bi-yearly/yearly basis.

For each issue of journal/periodical Publication Advisors (where applicable), Editors, Editorial Board, Executive Editors and related persons and for each article/articles published in the journal/periodical, the author/editor will be entitled to get honorium/allowance at the rate prescribed as per rules with the approval of the proper authority.

Manuscripts may be invited by advertising in journals for irregular publication. From the Bangladesh Film Archive's research report, voluntary submissions and manuscripts/proposals received on the basis of advertisement a limited number of selected manuscripts will be shortlisted considering funding and importance of each manuscript received from the authors. These will be evaluated/reviewed by an Technical on the subject matter. For each manuscript evaluated/reviewed the reviewer will receive Honorium at the prescribed rate as per rules. If the revised manuscript is finally approved by the Technical Committee as per the opinion of the reviewer, the author of the manuscript will receive the Honorium as per the rules.

Finalized manuscripts can be printed/ published by tendering process or placing a requisition on BG Press. All expenses related to publication will be met from the 'Printing and Binding' code of the budget. The Director of the Archive will be the co-ordinator of all publication related matters.

7. Research and training

The approved policies will be followed in regular research activities like Film collection, preservation and films related education :

Film collection, conservation and Film related research can be conducted. At the beginning of every year, research proposals shall be invited by publishing a notice in the widely circulated national daily newspapers. Film research proposals can also be submitted to the Bangladesh Film Archive on a self-Inspired basis. Research activities will be conducted on a limited number of selected proposals each year, considering the financial allocation and importance of the subject.

According to the recommendation of the Technical Committee, considering the allocation of research and the number of selected research proposals, the Film Archive authority will propose the allocation of research and send it to the Ministry for final approval. For each study selected researcher and Technical/supervisor will receive Honorium as per rules. All expenditure related to research will be met from the 'Research' Code in the budget. The Director of the Archive will be responsible for coordinating all research related matters.

There will be a Film Research Corner in Bangladesh Film Archive. Bangladesh Film Archive authority can launch 'Bangladesh Film Research Scholarship/Fellowship' with the approval of the government.

Local and foreign training and workshops for the officials of Bangladesh Film Archive and Film appreciation courses and higher Film appreciation courses can be organized time to time for the attractions of the viewers, Film makers and Film lovers.

Training concerned Honorium/remuneration and incidental expenses will be carried out with the approval of the authority.

Course fee may be collected from each student selected for admission at the rate prescribed from time to time.

8. Seminars/Workshops/Conferences

Bangladesh Film Archive will organize seminars, workshops, conferences and discussion programs on Film related issues to create awareness for Film collection and preservation. All expenses for seminars, workshops and discussion programs will be met from the concerned economic code as per government rules. In each session, the chairperson, scheduled discussants (per person), presenters/keynote discussants, moderators, presenters, coordinators, service staff and computer operators will receive Honorium/remuneration as per rules.

9. Use of Archive infrastructure and service facilities

Public/Private Institutions or Organizations may be permitted to use the infrastructural and other service facilities of the Archive paying fees as prescribed. Archive Auditorium/Projection Hall may be made available to Government/Private Institutions or Organizations, Film related clubs/ organizations for fixed rent. The Archive authority shall fix/re-fix the fee for using the auditorium and other services and facilities considering the utility/market value etc.

10. Sales and distribution

The Archive authority may appoint local and foreign booksellers as agents for the sale and marketing of books, journals, periodicals, CD/DVD of Films and documentaries. published and produced by the Archive. They will be able to participate in book fairs and similar exhibitions with material published by the Archive. The Archive authority may fix and refix the sale price of publications and sale price commission as per the recommendations of the Technical Committee. The Archive's Librarian will coordinate sales and distribution. Publication of the Archive may be distributed as a courtesy following the procedure prescribed by

the Bangladesh Film Archive authority. A dedicated bookshop/stall of Bangladesh Film Archive will be opened for the purpose of displaying and selling reproduced equipment of Film related publications, souvenirs, CDs, DVDs, posters, stills and other archival materials. In light of the recommendations of the Technical Committee, the Bangladesh Film Archive authority will take all steps to manage the bookshop/stall. Film students and registered societies associated with Films may be allowed for using the Auditorium/Projection Hall etc. at reduced rates.

11. Expert Services

To provide expertise services, advices and recommendations in the connection of Film collection, preservation, research, publication, training, study, awareness building and other activities as to be followed:

- a) Bangladesh Film Archive authority can form and renew one Technical Committee with not more than seven members for a period of two years with the approval of the Ministry.
- b) The Director General of Archive shall be appointed ex-officio Chairman of the Committee. One representative of Ministry; one representative of the department under the Ministry (Bangladesh Film Development Corporation (BFDC) of Films and Publications/Bangladesh Film Censor Board); and three representative committee members will be nominated from among Film personalities, Film teachers and technical experts. The Director of Film Archive will be appointed as Member-Secretary of the Committee.
- c) The members of the Technical Committee shall meet at least once in every three months and they shall be entitled to sitting allowance as per rules.
- d) The Technical Committee may form sub-committees to conduct the activities. The members of the subcommittee may hold as many meetings as may be necessary to complete the activities prescribed by the terms of reference. For this, each of them will be entitled to sitting Allowance as per rules.
- e) The Technical Committee will provide recommendations and advice on Film collection, conservation, library management, research, publication, training, service facilities and other awareness building activities and professional skills enhancement for the overall welfare and development of the Archive.
- f) Make recommendations regarding the organization of exhibitions, festivals, Seminars, workshops, discussions etc. on Films and Film related products.
- g) Advise to collect by purchase or exchange valuable and rare Films and award-winning Films in national and international contexts and make recommendations on the valuation of collectable Films.

- h) Advise and recommend the disposal or other action of archived Films and Film-related materials and other components, which are neither suitable for conservation nor recoverable, or if they are to be destroyable or saleble.
- j) Provide advice/recommendations for Film conservation, vault management and collection and storage of Film equipment and materials in Film Archive.
- j) Advise on the development and modernization of the library.
- k) Advise on planning and implementation of various matters relating to the overall development of the Film Archive.
- I) The committee may make recommendations for implementation/revision of policies.

12. Miscellaneous

- a) Bangladesh Film Archive will be enriched with a Liberation War Corner.
- b) A Film museum will be established at Bangladesh Film Archive.
- c) Initiatives will be taken on reproduction and marketing of Film posters, song books, screenplays, stills photographs, footage etc. can be undertaken. Documentaries on renowned and pioneer film and cultural personalities will be produced, preserved and conserved and marketed.
- d) Precautions will be taken regarding the protection of archived Films and the overall security of the Bangladesh Film Archive. Special precautions shall be taken in respect of fire safety.
- e) Special precautionary measures shall be taken of health issues of staffs engaged in Film conservation.
- f) International cooperation, agreements, initiatives will be taken to organize Film festivals, Film exchanges and other activities/events.
- g) Digital archiving will be introduced in Bangladesh Film Archive.
- h) Bangladesh Film Archive has planned to keep all the information of Bangladesh Film Archive and updated information related to Films on its website.
- i) Bangladesh Film Archive will organize national and international Film festivals, exhibitions, retrospectives etc.
- j) Initiatives can be taken for Film collection, conservation, restoration, training, research and institutional capacity building through international cooperations.

13. Correction

The authority may revise this policy, if and where necessary.
